H.R. 3051

An act to direct the Secretary of the Interior, the Bureau of Reclamation, to conduct a feasibility study on the Jicarilla Apache Reservation in the state of New Mexico, and for other purposes

As ordered reported by the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs on June 14, 2000

H.R. 3051 would direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study to determine the most feasible method of developing a safe and adequate municipal, rural, and industrial water supply for the residents of the Jicarilla Apache Indian Reservation in New Mexico. The bill would authorize the appropriation of \$200,000 to conduct this study. Assuming the availability of appropriated funds, CBO estimates that implementing H.R. 3051 would cost \$200,000 in fiscal year 2001.

H.R. 3051 would not affect direct spending or receipts; therefore, pay-as-you-go procedures would not apply. H.R. 3051 contains no private-sector or intergovernmental mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would have no significant impact on the budgets of state, local, or tribal governments.
