H.R. 708

An act to require the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study concerning grazing use of certain land within and adjacent to Grand Teton National Park, Wyoming, and to expand temporarily certain grazing privileges

As cleared by the Congress on November 4, 1997

H.R. 708 would require the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study of grazing use and open space of certain land within and adjacent to Grand Teton National Park. The legislation also would require the Secretary to reinstate and extend for at least three and one-half years certain grazing permits managed by the National Park Service within Grand Teton National Park. Under current law, NPS can spend those receipts without appropriation action. CBO estimates that offsetting receipts to the federal government from such grazing permits would total less than \$10,000 per year, and that the net effect on direct spending would be zero.
