**H.R. 4592**

**A bill to name the chapel located in the national cemetery in Los Angeles, California, as the “Bob Hope Veterans Chapel”**

*As introduced on April 25, 2002*

H.R. 4592 would name the chapel located in the national cemetery in Los Angeles, California, as the “Bob Hope Veterans Chapel.” It also would require that any reference to such chapel in any law, regulation, map, document, record, or other paper of the United States be considered a reference to the chapel. CBO estimates that implementing the bill would have a negligible cost, subject to the availability of appropriated funds. Because the bill would not affect direct spending or receipts, pay-as-you-go procedures would not apply.

H.R. 4592 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would not affect the budgets of state, local, or tribal governments.
