S. 1907

A bill to direct the Secretary of the Interior to convey certain land to the city of Haines, Oregon

*As ordered reported by the Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources
on June 5, 2002*

CBO estimates that enacting S. 1907 would not significantly affect the federal budget. The bill would not affect direct spending or receipts; therefore, pay-as-you-go procedures would not apply. S. 1907 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs on state, local, or tribal governments. Enacting this legislation would benefit the city of Haines by allowing them to acquire needed land at no cost.

S. 1907 would direct the Secretary of the Interior to convey to the city of Haines, Oregon, without consideration, approximately 40 acres of federal lands located within that state. According to the Bureau of Land Management, the lands to be conveyed currently generate no receipts and are not expected to over the next 10 years. Hence, we estimate that the proposed conveyance would not affect the federal budget.
