**H.R. 680**

**An act to direct the Secretary of the Interior to convey certain land held in trust for the Paiute Indian Tribe of Utah to the city of Richfield, Utah, and for other purposes**

*As ordered reported by the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs on June 29, 2005*

CBO estimates that implementing H.R. 680 would have no significant impact on the federal budget. Enacting H.R. 680 would not affect revenues or directing spending. H.R. 680 would direct the Secretary of the Interior to convey three acres of land held in trust for the Paiute Indian Tribe of Utah to Richfield, Utah, for use by a local municipal airport. Because the act would require the city to pay all costs related to the conveyance, there would be no federal administrative costs for the transfer.

H.R. 680 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs on state, local, or tribal governments. The land conveyances authorized by this bill would be voluntary on the part of the Paiute Tribe and the city of Richfield. Any costs they might incur to comply with the conditions of the conveyance would be incurred voluntarily.
