H.R. 326

**A bill to amend the Yuma Crossing National Heritage Area Act of 2000
to adjust the boundary of the Yuma Crossing National Heritage Area,
and for other purposes**

*As ordered reported by the Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources
on March 8, 2006*

H.R. 326 would modify the boundary of the Yuma Crossing National Heritage Area in Arizona to exclude certain private lands. CBO estimates that implementing this legislation would have no impact on the federal budget because the federal government is not expected to acquire or manage the affected properties.

H.R. 326 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs on state, local, or tribal governments.

On November 3, 2005, CBO transmitted a cost estimate for H.R. 326, as ordered reported by the House Committee on Resources on October 19, 2005. The two versions of the legislation are identical as are the cost estimates.
