**S. J. Res. 28**

**A joint resolution approving the location of the commemorative work  
in the District of Columbia honoring former  
President Dwight D. Eisenhower**

*As ordered reported by the Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources  
on March 8, 2006*

CBO estimates that enacting S.J. Res. 28 would have no impact on the federal budget. Enacting the bill would not affect direct spending or revenues. S.J. Res. 28 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would not affect the budgets of state, local, or tribal governments.

S.J. Res. 28 would approve the location—near the National Mall—recommended by the Secretary of the Interior for a commemorative work in the District of Columbia to honor Dwight D. Eisenhower. The Congress authorized a study for an Eisenhower memorial in 1999, and authorized the memorial in 2002.
