Reduce Commodity Payments to Wealthy Farmers. Reduces the direct payment cap from \$40,000 (\$32,000 for ACRE participants) to \$30,000 (\$24,000 for ACRE participants) per person. Also includes a three-year phased reduction in farm program average Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) eligibility limits from the current \$500,000 for non-farm AGI to \$250,000, and the farm AGI limit for eligibility for direct payments from the current \$750,000 to \$500,000 per person.

Eliminate Cotton and Peanut Storage Payments. Eliminates the requirement to pay storage costs for cotton under marketing assistance loans whenever the market price is below the applicable loan rate, and for peanuts whenever the crop under loan is forfeited to CCC.

Reauthorize Child Nutrition. The administration has not yet proposed a specific set of policies. This number represents their target level of spending on reauthorization. CBO estimate will be updated when specific policies are proposed.

Reform Market Access Program. The administration proposes to reduce annual funding for MAP, an export market promotion program, from \$200 million to \$160 million per year.

Discrimination Claims Settlement. The administration proposes an appropriation of \$1.150 billion to settle claims of prior discrimination brought by black farmers against USDA that were previously addressed by Sec. 14012 of the 2008 Farm Act. Score based on language in amendment received February 16, 2010.

User Fees. CBO considers mandatory user fees to be taxes (additional revenues), subject to a 25 percent offset. The NRCS fee proposal would be voluntary and, hence, would be offsetting collections.
