**A bill to provide for a feasibility study of alternatives
to augment the water supplies of the Central Oklahoma
Master Conservancy District and cities served by the District**

As ordered reported by the House Committee on Natural Resources on June 28, 2007

H.R. 1337 would authorize the Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) to conduct a feasibility study of alternatives to augment the water supplies of the Central Oklahoma Master Conservancy District and cities served by the District. Assuming appropriation of the authorized amount, CBO estimates that BOR would spend \$900,000 over the 2008-2012 period to complete the study. Enacting the legislation would not affect direct spending or revenues.

The legislation contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs of state, local, or tribal governments.

On May 29, 2007, CBO transmitted a cost estimate for S. 175, a bill to provide for a feasibility study of alternatives to augment the water supplies of the Central Oklahoma Master Conservancy District and cities served by the district, as ordered reported by the Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources on May 23, 2007. The two bills are identical, as are the CBO cost estimates.
