**H.R. 3320
Support for the Museum of the History of Polish Jews Act of 2007**

*As ordered reported by the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations
on April 22, 2008*

H.R. 3320 would authorize the appropriation of \$5 million to develop and maintain a permanent collection at the Museum of the History of Polish Jews in Warsaw, Poland. The museum contains multimedia exhibits detailing the history and culture of Jewish people in Poland over the past 1,000 years.

Based on historical spending patterns for similar grants for cultural programs, CBO estimates that implementing this legislation would cost \$3 million in 2009 and \$5 million over the 2009-2013 period, subject to the appropriation of the authorized amounts. Implementing the act would have no effect on direct spending or revenues.

H.R. 3320 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would not affect the budgets of state, local, or tribal governments.
