

CONGRESSIONAL BUDGET OFFICE COST ESTIMATE

H.R. 433 District of Columbia Management Restoration Act of 1999

As ordered reported by the House Committee on Government Reform on February 3, 1999

H.R. 433 would return to the office of the mayor of the District of Columbia primary responsibility for overseeing nine departments of the District government. The National Capital Revitalization and Self-Government Improvement Act of 1997 transferred responsibility for those departments to the District of Columbia Financial Responsibility and Management Assistance Authority.

CBO estimates that enacting H.R. 433 would have no effect on the federal budget. Because the bill would not affect direct spending or receipts, pay-as-you-go procedures would not apply. H.R. 433 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs on state, local, or tribal governments.
