**H.R. 5106
Copyright Technical Corrections Act of 2000**

As ordered reported by the House Committee on the Judiciary on September 13, 2000

H.R. 5106 would make certain technical changes to copyright law concerning retransmissions of television programming by satellite carriers. The bill also would renumber and retitle several sections of law related to copyrights. Finally, H.R. 5106 would repeal an expired provision of copyright law related to electronic audiovisual games.

CBO estimates that enacting the bill would have no significant impact on the federal budget because the bill's provisions are all technical in nature. Because the bill would not affect direct spending or receipts, pay-as-you-go procedures would not apply.

H.R. 5106 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs on state, local, or tribal governments.
