H.R. 5136

A bill to make permanent the authority of the Marshal of the Supreme Court and the Supreme Court Police to provide security beyond the Supreme Court building and grounds

As ordered reported by the House Committee on the Judiciary on September 20, 2000

H.R. 5136 would authorize the Marshal of the Supreme Court and the Supreme Court Police to provide security beyond the Supreme Court building and grounds for Justices, employees of the court, and official visitors. Based on information from the Supreme Court, CBO estimates that implementing H.R. 5136 would cost less than \$10,000 a year over the five-year period to pay for personnel and transportation expenses, subject to the availability of appropriated funds.

H.R. 5136 would have no effect on direct spending or receipts; therefore, pay-as-you-go procedures would not apply. H.R. 5136 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would not affect state, local, or tribal governments.
