**H. Con. Res. 25**

**Expressing the sense of the Congress regarding tuberous sclerosis**

*As ordered reported by the House Committee on Energy and Commerce on July 18, 2001*

H. Con. Res. 25 would express the support of the Congress for efforts to encourage early and complete clinical testing for tuberous sclerosis, to raise awareness of the needs for clinical testing, and to increase research to improve the detection and treatment of tuberous sclerosis. The resolution also would urge the Director of the National Institutes of Health to develop a five-year research plan for improving detection and treatment of tuberous sclerosis. CBO estimates that passing H. Con. Res. 25 would result in no significant cost to the federal government. The resolution would not affect direct spending or receipts; therefore, pay-as-you-go procedures would not apply.
