**H.R. 2925**

**An act to amend the Reclamation Recreation Management Act of 1992  
in order to provide for the security of dams, facilities, and resources  
under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Reclamation**

*As cleared by the Congress on October 30, 2001, and signed by the President on  
November 12, 2001*

H.R. 2925 (enacted as Public Law 107-69) authorizes the Secretary of the Interior to contract with other federal agencies, state and local governments, or tribal governments to provide law enforcement personnel to protect Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) facilities and lands and enforce federal laws.

H.R. 2925 establishes criminal fines for new crimes at BOR facilities and on BOR lands. Based on information from BOR, CBO estimates that any additional revenues collected as a result of implementing H.R. 2925 will not be significant because of the small number of individuals that are likely to be subject to such fines. Criminal fines are recorded as governmental receipts (i.e., revenues), deposited in the Crime Victims Fund, and later spent without further appropriation action.
