H.R. 4692

A bill to amend the act entitled “An act to authorize the establishment of the Andersonville National Historic Site in the state of Georgia, and for other purposes,” to provide for the addition of certain donated lands to the Andersonville National Historic Site

As ordered reported by the House Committee on Resources on September 12, 2002

H.R. 4692 would expand the boundary of the Andersonville National Historic Site in Georgia from 500 acres to 520 acres. The bill would enable the National Park Service (NPS) to accept the donation of 20 acres from the Friends of Andersonville, a local nonprofit organization.

CBO estimates that implementing H.R. 4692 would result in no significant cost to the federal government because the donated land, which is contiguous to the existing park entrance, would not be developed. Enacting the bill would not affect direct spending or revenues.

H.R. 4692 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would have no significant impact on the budgets of state, local, or tribal governments.
