# **S. 862**

**State Criminal Alien Assistance Program Reauthorization Act of 2001** 

As reported by the Senate Committee on the Judiciary on July 18, 2002

## SUMMARY

S. 862 would authorize the appropriation of \$750 million for each of fiscal years 2002 through 2006 for the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program, which makes grants to state and local governments to cover the costs of incarcerating undocumented criminal aliens. Assuming appropriation of the authorized amounts (beginning with 2003), CBO estimates that implementing S. 862 would cost about \$2.7 billion over the 2003-2007 period. This legislation would not affect direct spending or receipts, so pay-as-you-go procedures would not apply.

The bill contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act (UMRA). The bill would benefit state and local governments by extending the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program and increasing its authorized funding.

### ESTIMATED COST TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

Except for 2002, CBO assumes that the amounts authorized in S. 862 will be appropriated by the start of each fiscal year and that outlays will follow the historical spending pattern for the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program. We do not expect any additional supplemental appropriations to be provided for the remainder of fiscal year 2002. The estimated budgetary impact of S. 862 is shown in the following table. The costs of this legislation fall within budget function 750 (administration of justice).
