

CONGRESSIONAL BUDGET OFFICE COST ESTIMATE

H.R. 1577

A bill to designate the visitor center in Organ Pipe Cactus National Monument in Arizona as the "Kris Eggle Visitor Center"

As ordered reported by the Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources on June 25, 2003

H.R. 1577 would dedicate the visitor center at Organ Pipe Cactus National Monument to Kris Eggle, a park ranger at the monument who was killed in the line of duty. The act would designate the visitor center as the Kriss Eggle Visitor Center and direct the Secretary of the Interior to post interpretive signs at the monument to explain the designation. For these purposes, the act would authorize the appropriation of whatever amounts are necessary.

Based on information provided by the National Park Service, CBO estimates that implementing H.R. 1577 would cost less than \$50,000. Moreover, some of the cost of installing interpretive signs may have been incurred even in the absence of legislation.

H.R. 1577 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined by the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would not affect the budgets of state, local, or tribal governments.
