Upper Missouri River Breaks Boundary Clarification Act

As ordered reported by the House Committee on Resources on October 29, 2003

H.R. 1629 would clarify that the Upper Missouri River Breaks National Monument should not contain any privately owned property. CBO estimates that implementing this clarification (primarily by redrawing existing maps of the national monument) would have no significant effect on the federal budget. The monument was created in 2001 and is managed by the Bureau of Land Management. It contains about 380,000 acres of federal land (and as much as 82,000 acres of private property) in Montana.

The bill contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs on state, local, or tribal governments.
