Little Butte/Bear Creek Subbasins Water Feasibility Act

As ordered reported by the House Committee on Resources on September 15, 2004

H.R. 3210 would authorize the Bureau of Reclamation to conduct a water management feasibility study of the Little Butte and Bear Creek watersheds in Medford, Oregon. The study would identify ways to meet future water supply needs and to improve water quality, as well as water conservation and storage measures. H.R. 3210 would authorize the appropriation of \$500,000 for this study.

Assuming appropriation of the necessary amounts, CBO estimates that implementing H.R. 3210 would cost \$500,000 in 2005. Enacting H.R. 3210 would not affect direct spending or revenues.

H.R. 3210 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs on state, local, or tribal governments.
