Angel Island Immigration Station Restoration and Preservation Act

As ordered reported by the House Committee on Resources on September 15, 2004

H.R. 4469 would authorize the appropriation of \$15 million to restore the Angel Island Immigration Station, a California state park in the San Francisco Bay. Assuming appropriation of this amount, CBO estimates that the National Park Service would disburse the \$15 million over the next three or four years as grants to the Angel Island Immigration Station Foundation, a local nonprofit organization. Most of that funding would be used to restore the station hospital.

The legislation contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs on state, local, or tribal governments.
