**H.R. 374**

**A bill to require the Secretary of the Interior to accept the conveyance of certain land, to be held in trust for the benefit of the Puyallup Indian tribe**

*As ordered reported by the House Committee on Resources on March 29, 2006*

H.R. 374 would require the Department of the Interior to take into trust two parcels of land in the city of Fife, Washington. The legislation also would require the department to take certain additional parcels into trust, if acquired by the tribe. Because these parcels of land would be owned by the tribe prior to transfer and the government would incur no significant additional costs in taking them into trust, CBO estimates that implementing this bill would have no significant effect on the federal budget.

H.R. 374 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act. Enacting this legislation would benefit the Puyallup tribe and several affected local governments in Washington state.
