**H.R. 866**

**An act to make technical corrections to the United States Code**

*As reported by the Senate Committee on the Judiciary on September 7, 2006*

CBO estimates that enacting H.R. 866 would have no impact on the federal budget. Enacting the legislation would not affect direct spending or revenues. H.R. 866 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would not affect the budgets of state, local, or tribal governments.

H.R. 866 would correct cross-references, typographical errors, and make changes to various parts of the United States Code. Because those changes are technical, CBO estimates that enacting H.R. 866 would have no budgetary impact.

On April 5, 2005, CBO transmitted a cost estimate for H.R. 866, as ordered report by the House Committee on the Judiciary on April 13, 2005. The two versions of the legislation are identical and the estimated costs are the same.
