Dear Mr. Chairman:

The Congressional Budget Office and the Joint Committee on Taxation (JCT) have estimated the effects on direct spending and revenues of H.R. 2419, the Food and Energy Security Act of 2007, as passed by the Senate on December 14, 2007, relative to CBO's March 2008 baseline projections. As requested by staff of the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry, this estimate assumes that certain modifications (described below) would be made to the legislation. CBO estimates that enacting the modified legislation would increase direct spending by \$9.6 billion over the 2008-2018 period, relative to the baseline projections and assuming that the legislation would remain in effect throughout the period. JCT estimates that revenues would increase under the proposal by \$4.5 billion over the same period. On balance, those changes to the unified budget would produce net costs (increases in deficits or reductions in surpluses) of \$5.1 billion over the 11-year period. The enclosed table provides more details on those estimates.

This estimate assumes that H.R. 2419 would be modified to: have an effective date of October 1, 2008, for most changes to nutrition programs (title IV); end the Fruit and Vegetable Program (section 4904) in 2012; update the provisions of Fruit and Vegetable Purchases (section 4907) to reflect new Section 32 baseline estimates; and set the amount transferred to the Social Security Trust Funds (title XII, subtitle F) equal to the estimated loss to the trust funds that would otherwise result from this legislation.
