H.R. 761

A bill to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to convey to the Missouri River Basin Lewis and Clark Interpretive Trail and Visitor Center Foundation, Inc., certain federal lands associated with the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail in Nebraska, to be used as an historical interpretative site along the trail

As ordered reported by the House Committee on Natural Resources on June 28, 2007

H.R. 761 would authorize the Department of the Interior (DOI) to convey two parcels of federally owned land, and a visitor center located on the property, associated with the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail in Nebraska to the Missouri River Basin Lewis and Clark Interpretive Trail and Visitor Center Foundation, Inc. The foundation would continue to operate the land as an historic site and interpretive center.

Assuming appropriation of the authorized amount and based on information provided by the agency, CBO estimates that DOI would spend \$150,000 per year to assist with operation of the facility. Enacting the legislation would not affect direct spending or revenues.

The legislation contains no private-sector or intergovernmental mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs on state, local, or tribal governments.
