**H.R. 2330
Camp Hale Study Act**

*As ordered reported by the Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources
on December 16, 2009*

H.R. 2330 would require the National Park Service (NPS) and U.S. Forest Service to conduct a study of Camp Hale, a former military training area in Colorado, to determine the feasibility and suitability of designating the site as a unit of the National Park System or using some other means of protecting the camp. Based on information provided by the NPS and assuming the availability of appropriations, CBO estimates that conducting the required study would cost less than \$500,000 over the next three years. Enacting H.R. 2330 would not affect revenues or direct spending.

H.R. 2330 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs on state, local, or tribal governments.
