H.R. 5493

A bill to provide for the furnishing of statues by the District of Columbia for display in Statuary Hall in the United States Capitol

As ordered reported by the House Committee on Administration on July 14, 2010

H.R. 5493 would authorize the President to invite the District of Columbia to place up to two statues of deceased citizens known for distinguished civic or military service in Statuary Hall in the United States Capitol. The bill also would require the District of Columbia to cover the costs of providing new statues. CBO estimates that implementing H.R. 5493 would have no significant impact on the federal budget. Enacting the bill would not affect direct spending or revenues; therefore, pay-as-you-go procedures would not apply.

H.R. 5493 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs on state, local, or tribal governments.
