Violators of the bill's provisions could be subject to criminal fines, so the government might collect more fines if the bill is enacted. Criminal fines are recorded as revenues, then deposited in the Crime Victims Fund, and later spent. Enacting S. 2925 could increase revenues and direct spending, but CBO estimates that the net budget impact would not be significant in any year.
