This resolution would provide funding through December 15, 2013. It includes effects of the 2013 sequestration. Amounts are shown on an annualized basis.

1. These amounts are subject to discretionary spending limits in the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 as amended (the Deficit Control Act). The spending limits were established in the Budget Control Act of 2011 (P.L. 112-25), which amended the Deficit Control Act.
2. Designated pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(ii) of the Deficit Control Act.
3. This resolution provides funding to continue 2013 discretionary appropriations not otherwise provided for in the Pay Our Military Act (Public Law 113-39). CBO estimated that the Act provided \$5 billion in budget authority for Coast Guard pay and allowances. Therefore, the estimate of amounts provided by this resolution have been reduced accordingly.
