**S. 662
Harriet Beecher Stowe House Special Resource Study Act**

*As ordered reported by the Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources
on May 7, 2008*

S. 662 would require the National Park Service (NPS) to conduct a study to determine the suitability and feasibility of establishing the Harriet Beecher Stowe House in Maine as a unit of the National Park System. Based on information provided by the NPS and assuming the availability of appropriated funds, CBO estimates that carrying out the proposed study would cost about \$200,000 over the 2009-2012 period. Enacting the legislation would not affect direct spending or revenues.

S. 662 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would not affect the budgets of state, local, or tribal governments.
