S. 1276

Methamphetamine Production Prevention Act of 2008

As reported by the Senate Committee on the Judiciary on September 15, 2008

Current law requires retail distributors of certain pharmaceuticals to maintain records for each sale. S. 1276 would make minor changes to the recordkeeping procedures that must be followed in such transactions. CBO estimates that implementing S. 1276 would have no significant cost to the federal government. Any such effects would be subject to the availability of appropriated funds. Enacting the bill would not affect direct spending or revenues.

S. 1276 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs on state, local, or tribal governments.
