This resolution would provide funding through December 15, 2013, except for \$636 million for wildland fire management (secs. 126 and 127), which is available until expended. It includes effects of the 2013 sequestration. Amounts are shown on an annualized basis. There are no amounts designated as emergency funding in this resolution.

1. These amounts are subject to discretionary spending limits in the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 as amended (the Deficit Control Act). The spending limits were established in the Budget Control Act of 2011 (P.L. 112-25), which amended the Deficit Control Act.
 2. Assumes continuation of the 2013 discretionary appropriations under the same authority and conditions provided in the 2013 acts except for the full-year funding in the Continuing Appropriations Resolution, 2013 (P.L. 112-175) and funding in the Disaster Relief Appropriations Act, 2013 (P.L. 113-2).
 3. Designated pursuant to section 251(b)(2) of the Deficit Control Act.
 4. CBO and the staff of the Joint Committee on Taxation estimate that section 137 (contained in the proposed amendment to H. J. Res. 59) would reduce budget authority and outlays in 2014 and over the 2014-2023 period. That section also would result in a loss of revenues in 2014 and over the 2014-2023 period. We are not able to provide an estimate of the net budgetary effect of section 137 at this time. CBO estimates that section 138 (also included in the proposed amendment) would have no budgetary effect.
