Grant-Kohrs Ranch National Historic Site Boundary Adjustment Act of 1998

As ordered reported by the Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources on July 29, 1998

CBO estimates that enacting S. 2272 would have no significant impact on the federal budget. The bill would not affect direct spending or receipts; therefore, pay-as-you-go procedures would not apply. S. 2272 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would not affect the budgets of state, local, or tribal governments.

S. 2272 would adjust the boundary of the Grant-Kohrs National Historic Site to include an additional 120 acres. Because the federal government already owns the additional acreage, no land would have to be acquired to make the boundary adjustment. Based on information provided by the National Park Service, CBO expects that the agency would incur no additional development, operating, or other costs as a result of including this land within the park.
