In January, 2014, both the House and Senate Budget Committees filed allocations for the Appropriations Committees (known as a 302(a) allocation). The allocations were made pursuant to Division A of P.L. 113-67, the Bipartisan Budget Act of 2013. The allocations were equal to the budget authority and outlays estimated for the 2014 discretionary appropriations (as shown in the table above). The Appropriations Committees have not filed new allocations by subcommittee (known as a 302(b) allocation).

1. These amounts are subject to discretionary spending limits in the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (the Deficit Control Act), as amended. The spending limits were established in the Bipartisan Budget Act of 2013, which amended the Deficit Control Act. The spending limits in 2014 are \$520,646 million for the defense category and \$491,773 million for the nondefense category, for a total of \$1,012,237 million.
2. The spending limits set by the Deficit Control Act are to be adjusted to accommodate appropriations for these purposes, pursuant to section 251(b)(2) of that act.
3. In the House, pursuant to section 314(d) of the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974, amounts designated as an emergency requirement for FY 2014 shall not count for purposes of Sec. 302(b) of the act.
4. P.L. 113-95 (see below for title) was enacted on April 3, 2014. CBO estimates that this bill will result in an increase in outlays of \$350 million in 2014. The Senate assigned this bill to the Foreign Relations Committee.

They are designated pursuant to section 251(b)(2) of the Deficit Control Act. In the House, the spending limits set by the Deficit Control Act (see footnote 1) are to be adjusted to accommodate appropriations for OCO, disaster relief, and program integrity. Pursuant to section 314(d) of the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1975, the House does not count amounts designated as emergency requirements for purposes of section 302(b) of the act.
