H.R. 2023 would require the Administration to provide two reports to the Congress about energy security in Europe. The Department of State would report on its ongoing promotion of energy security in Ukraine. The bill also would require the Director of National Intelligence to report on effects on national security of a gas pipeline from Russia to Germany.

On the basis of information about similar reporting requirements, CBO estimates that implementing the bill would cost less than \$500,000 over the 2019-2024 period; such spending would be subject to the availability of appropriated funds.
