H.R. 3409 would authorize appropriations for the ongoing activities of the Coast Guard. Direct spending costs result primarily from section 212 (Research Projects; Transactions Other Than Contracts and Grants), which would allow the Coast Guard to spend funds recovered without further appropriation, and section 426 (Liability Limits), which would allow the Coast Guard to lower the liability limits for deepwater ports for the costs of oil spill removal and damages.
