H.R. 3889 would authorize the appropriation of \$2 million annually over the 2020-2024 period for the National Community Anti-Drug Coalition Institute. The legislation also would make technical changes to certain laws related to the Office of National Drug Control Policy and its efforts to control drugs.

Assuming appropriation of the specified amounts, CBO estimates that implementing H.R. 3889 would cost \$2 million in 2020 and \$10 million over the 2020-2024 period. The costs of the legislation (detailed in Table 1) fall within budget 800 (general government).
