Section 2 would repeal a program to lease federal lands in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge (ANWR) in Alaska for oil and gas exploration and production. Section 3 would establish permanent fees for inspections of offshore oil and gas leases; collections from those fees would be recorded as reductions in direct spending.

CBO has not completed an estimate of the effect of Rules Committee Print 116-30 with the Manager's Amendment on spending subject to appropriation or an analysis of intergovernmental and private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act.

CBO estimates that enacting the legislation, with the Manager's amendment, would not affect revenues.
