S. 2547 states that it is the policy of the United States to:

- Promote democracy and human rights;
- Compete with China by expanding military, diplomatic, and economic cooperation with U.S. allies; and
- Develop a unified approach with those allies to challenges posed by China.

CBO expects that enacting the bill would not change U.S. foreign policy; therefore, CBO estimates that implementing S. 2547 would not affect the federal budget.
