H.R. 8259 would prohibit the Administration from using federal funds to facilitate Russia's participation in a meeting of the international intergovernmental economic organizations known as the Group of Seven or the Group of Eight.

H.R. 8259 also would require the Administration to report to the Congress on Russian threats to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization coalition in Afghanistan and the Administration's efforts to counter those threats. On the basis of information about similar requirements, CBO estimates that providing the required report would cost less than \$500,000 over the 2021- 2025 period. Such spending would be subject to the availability of appropriated funds.
