

Discretionary Spending Under Division M, the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021

December 22, 2020

Division M of H.R. 133 would provide supplemental appropriations for federal agencies to respond to the novel coronavirus pandemic and provide assistance to nonfederal entities. Those amounts would be designated as emergency spending, in keeping with section 251 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985. The limits on discretionary budget authority established by the Budget Control Act of 2011 (Public Law 112-25), as amended, would be adjusted to accommodate such spending.

For this table, CBO's estimates were made in consultation with the House and Senate Committees on the Budget and in keeping with section 1401 of division O of the legislation. The amounts account for the budgetary effects of title VIII of division O and title XIII of division FF. Title VIII of division O would amend Public Law 116-136 to expand the purview of the Pandemic Response Accountability Committee, which conducts oversight of spending related to the coronavirus pandemic. CBO estimates that enacting that provision would have no effect on federal spending. Title XIII of division FF would extend the date through which the Department of Housing and Urban Development could liquidate existing obligations of certain funding provided for the Community Development Block Grant Program. This table reflects CBO's estimate of the budgetary effects of that provision, which are within the jurisdiction of the Subcommittee on Transportation and Housing and Development.
