On August 5, 2022, CBO issued a revision to the table published on August 3, 2022, to include estimates of spending for sections 13601 and 13802. As a result, the updated estimate of the deficit reduction was lowered by \$11.0 billion over the 2022-2031 period. CBO's estimate of H.R. 5376, the Build Back Better Act, as passed by the House of Representatives on November 19, 2021, also did not include an estimate of the spending that would result from enacting a similar provision, section 136701. As a result, the estimated deficit for that piece of legislation also would be different, but CBO has not finished its estimate of that spending.

Titles I, II, III, IV, VI, VII, and VIII would not increase on-budget deficits after 2031.

CBO cannot determine whether part 6 of title V would increase or decrease deficits after 2031 because there is significant uncertainty about federal mineral leasing and energy development activities and related receipts after 2031. The remaining provisions of title V would not increase deficits after 2031.

- a. The Budget Control Act of 2011 (BCA) requires the annual sequestration of nonexempt mandatory spending programs. The Office of Management and Budget determines which accounts are subject to reductions under the BCA. Some of the accounts affected by title II are subject to sequestration; this estimate reflects the effects of sequestration on those accounts.
- b. Postal Service cash flows are recorded in the Postal Service Fund in the federal budget and are classified as off-budget. Title VII of the legislation would transfer funds from the Treasury to the Postal Service Fund; that transfer would be classified as an on-budget transaction.
- c. CBO expects that the provisions in title I that would increase funding for tax enforcement activities also would increase revenues. However, under guidelines agreed to by the legislative and executive branches, that change is not included in this cost estimate, although it would be reflected in CBO's baseline budget projections after the legislation was enacted. CBO estimates that as a result of those increases in outlays, revenues would increase by \$204 billion over the 2022-2031 period.
