H.R. 1615 would prohibit the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) from using federal funds to curtail or prohibit the use or sale of gas stoves. It also would prevent CPSC from issuing any rule that would substantially raise the average price of gas stoves. Using information from the commission, CBO estimates that enacting H.R. 1615 would have no effect on the federal budget.
