H.R. 6087 would extend the Young African Leaders Initiative (YALI) for five years following enactment and would require the Department of State to report to the Congress on its implementation of the initiative.

The costs of the legislation, detailed in Table 1, fall within budget function 150 (international affairs).

YALI was established in 2010 to support young African leaders in the areas of civic engagement, business, and public management. The program received \$43 million for 2023 and the Administration requested \$46 million to operate YALI in 2024. After adjusting for inflation, CBO estimates that extending YALI under H.R. 6087 would cost a total of \$142 million over the 2024-2028 period, subject to the appropriation of the estimated amounts.



Using information about the costs of similar reports, CBO estimates that satisfying the reporting requirement in H.R. 6087 would cost less than \$500,000 over the 2024-2028 period; any spending would be subject to the availability of appropriated funds.
