S. 265 would reauthorize the rural emergency medical service training and equipment assistance program from 2024 through 2028; \$11 million was appropriated for that program in 2023. The program awards grants to rural communities for training emergency medical service personnel, and it provides assistance for equipment purchases. The bill would require grant recipients to provide training for mental health and substance use disorder emergencies.

Accounting for anticipated inflation and using historical spending patterns for the program, CBO estimates that implementing S. 265 would cost \$46 million over the 2024-2028 period. Any spending would be subject to the availability of appropriated funds.

The costs of the legislation, detailed in Table 1, fall within budget function 550 (health).
