Divison A would provide appropriations for fiscal year 2024 to respond to the situation in Ukraine and Israel and to provide other related assistance. The legislation would designate those amounts as emergency requirements in keeping with section 251 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

a. Two provisions of division A would affect nonemergency spending. Specifically, CBO estimates that section 201 of title II (Energy and Water) would increase uranium-related receipts by a total of \$500 million over the 2028-2033 period, thus reducing nonemergency budget authority and outlays. CBO also estimates that section 608 of title VI (State and Foreign Operations) would increase nonemergency outlays for direct loans to the International Monetary Fund by \$275 million over the 2026-2030 period.
