H.R. 9711 would require CBO to publish on its website an annual schedule of the expected publication dates of major recurring reports. The bill would require CBO to update the schedule as necessary throughout the year.

CBO publishes on its website a schedule of upcoming releases. As a result, implementing the bill would not affect federal spending.
